Tokyo night tour Jan.17

This tour visits popular sightseeing spots like Tokyo Tower, Rainbow bridge, Odaiba, Ginza, with impressive night views. You can enjoy a dynamic sightseeing experience that differs greatly from the daytime scenery.



Jan.19 River Cruise & Hama-rikyu Gardens

This half-hour boat cruise down the Sumida River travels under some 14 bridges, showing the capital’s famous landmarks along the way. The cruise will arrive at the majestic Hama-rikyu Gardens, located along the Tokyo Waterfront. Visitors can enjoy a walk in the beautifully preserved garden that the family of the ruling Tokugawa Shogun owned from the 17th to the mid-19th century, where they used to go hunting with falcons.
